№ The Lord's Supper

As Lutheran Christians we take Jesus at His Word (*Matthew 26:26-29; I Cor. 10:16-22; 11:23-29*), believing that, in, with and under the bread and the wine, we receive His body and blood in this Holy Meal. We further confess that Jesus offers Himself to us for the forgiveness of our sins, the strengthening of our faith and the building up of our fellowship with one another.

If you desire to participate in communion this morning, we invite you to partake in one of two ways. If you are in agreement with our understanding of this Holy Meal, come forward and receive it with us. Uncertain in your understanding of the Lord's Supper? You and your family may still come forward for a blessing from the Pastor. Simply cross your arms over your heart when the communion assistant offers you the bread and that is a signal to the Pastors that you would like a blessing.

For those not able to consume alcohol for a medical reason, in the center of each communion tray there is "alcohol free" (less than .5%) wine. Also, for those who are gluten intolerant, there are gluten free wafers in the center of each bread dish.

FROM DIRECTOR OF MUSIC AND PERFORMING ARTS

For our final article on the parts of a worship service, we look at the doors and windows. After all the walls have been built and finished in a house, we usually put in the doors and windows. Doors and windows are ways to encounter different things (people at the front door, a cool breeze through a window, checking on your children playing in the backyard through a sliding glass door, etc.) In

worship, these doors and windows are ways to encounter **God**, as well as respond to what He is doing. Typically we do this in three ways: music, prayers, and utilizing tradition, especially the Christian Church Year.

Worship **music** is edifying (big word meaning the instruction or improvement of a person morally or intellectually). It is edifying because it teaches us about God's ways through its text, and putting it in a musical form gives us an emotional connection that text simply cannot do alone. We encounter God through these texts and through the Holy Spirit moving among us as we sing. It is not only a way to encounter God, but one of the main ways we respond to Him as well. Because of this we want to utilize a variety of styles of music (hymnody, praise music, gospel music, spirituals, taize, etc.) With all of this music we sing together His praises, with one voice, celebrating what He has done for all people. (Colossians 3:16, Ephesians 5:19, Hebrews 2:12, Psalm 105:2)

Prayer is an important part of worship because it is an effective way to communicate with God. We have multiple opportunities throughout the service to lift up our 'prayers and praises'. God tells us to pray not just for ourselves, but for other people as well, which is why we do Prayers of the Church. Prayer is powerful and when utilized in a corporate setting, it can do amazing things through the Holy Spirit. (*Ephesians 6:18, 1 John 5:14, 2 Chronicles 6:21, Jeremiah 29:12*)

It is important to maintain **tradition** because we need to remember where we came from and who we are! Our parents and elders have a lot that they can teach us and if we don't listen, we won't be able to pass it down to our children. Even Paul talks about the importance of keeping some tradition (2 Thessalonians 2:15). Traditions such as the Christian Church Year help us with our worship life by making sure that we tell God's Story throughout the year, remembering all of what He has done for us. It helps us to keep the focus on Christ, instead of ourselves. We should never do tradition for traditions sake, but tradition should be a tool that we can utilize to encounter God. (Deuteronomy 11:19, 1 Corinthians 11:2, Matthew 15:3, 2 Timothy 4:2-4)

Music, prayer and tradition are important ways to encounter and respond to God in our worship. Yet, like adding doors and windows in a house each of these have different purposes and styles, and can change depending on what is needed for the house. We would never use a closet door as our front door and it would probably be overkill to put a giant bay window in your shower, when you just need a little window to let the steam out. Every church is different with style preferences and resources and even in the worship service itself, there are various styles and functions of music, prayer and tradition.

At Trinity we have a wide variety of people in the congregation, so we have a wide variety of ways to encounter God. When we gather for worship we utilize several different styles of music, prayer, and traditions, to help support the weekly theme and focus on what God is telling us through His Word. But while we might have a variety of styles and functions, we still strive to have worship that is historically rooted, culturally aware, and above all points back to Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior. *Soli Deo Gloria*.

Lutheran Women in Mission

Mission grants especially meaningful to two Trinity women

At the national level, LWML has a goal of funding **21 mission grants** totaling **\$2,100,000** for the 2019-2021 biennium. Two of these mission grants are especially meaningful to Trinity members Alvila Burkett and Pat Reck-Wilson.

From Alvila Burkett....

It is always good to hear about the rewarding of LWML funds to needy causes. But it was especially exciting for me this year to see that the Wind River Indian Reservation in Wyoming, where I grew up near the Reservation and where my Mother taught school to Indian children, was the recipient of funds to purchase a van that will take children 44 miles to Sunday School and 33 miles to "Monday" school. The LCMS now has a mission church on the reservation.

From Pat Reck-Wilson....

Folks! Your Mites and precious pennies go next Sunday, celebrating LWML SUNDAY, to reach the half million Indigenous children of isolated lands in November's feature Gospel Outreach Projects: God's Grace for This Generation, LAMP MINISTRY, Canada, & The Wind River, Wyoming Reservation Transportation project. For nearly 50 years, volunteers have answered God's calling in Matthew 28:19 to Go and Share the Gospel "in villages in Canada and the northern reservations reachable only by aircraft or seasonal roads. Half of the population in Canada is under the age of 14, and alarming statistics remind us 15 percent of children and youth will actually take their own lives out of despair and hopelessness, disease, alcoholism. With VBS, Bible studies, personal witnessing, and access to Christian education for faith in Christ, we aim to train folk to GO touch and change the lives of this generation.

Next week, on LWML Sunday, you can drop this special mission offering in the mite box on your way into church. Thank you for joining with LWML in funding these two mission grants as well as many others in Oregon, across the country, and throughout the world.


