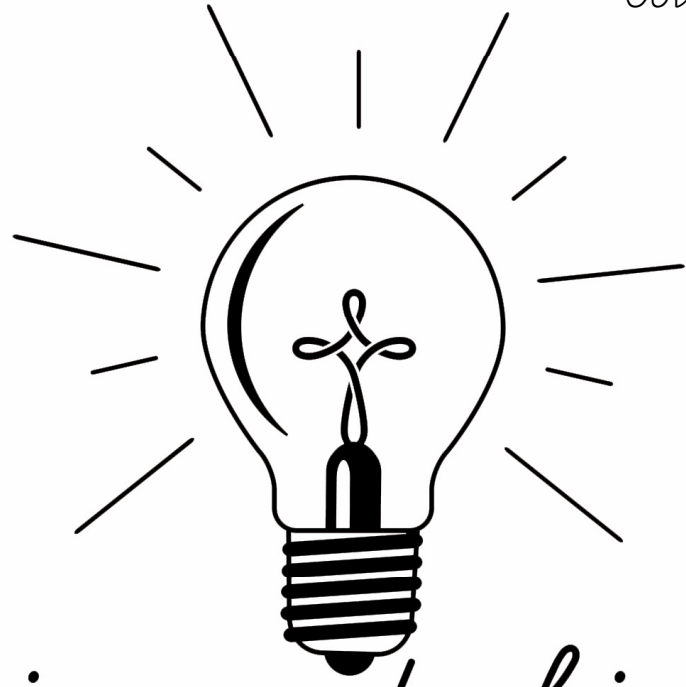

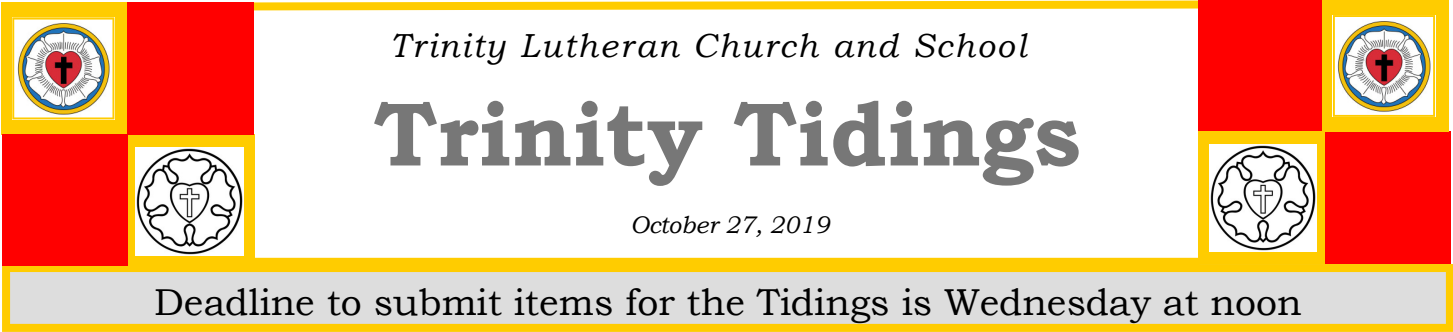

Last week we looked at the foundation of our worship services, which was Scripture with Jesus Christ as the cornerstone. As it is with building a house, after we have a foundation we can start building the walls. Lutherans have always been about Word and Sacrament ministry, so this might not be new to some of us, but it is a good reminder as to what we do in our worship services. These walls do have a particular order and do not make much sense if taken out of order: **GATHERING, WORD, TABLE, and SENDING.**

We call the beginning of the service the **GATHERING**, because it is where God gathers us together to unite our spirits in His presence, remind us of our sinfulness and need for a Savior, and to prepare us to hear God's Word. Some of the elements we could have in this part of the service include: Invocation, Call to Worship, Music, Confession & Absolution. We try to focus on God's actions and what He did for us. Confession gives us an opportunity to ask for forgiveness, to cleanse ourselves. In doing so, we are able to be more open to God working in our lives, giving us an opportunity to be filled even fuller with Spirit and truth. (Psalm 75:1, 2 Timothy 2:21-25)

After we have focused our hearts and minds on worship, we hear from God's **WORD**. The point is not really to learn (even though we do), but to hear from God Himself. We do this through various scripture readings and the sermon, all of which point to Jesus Christ. It is important to hear God's Word so that we can share it with others and constantly apply it to our lives. (2 Timothy 4:2, Matthew 13:23)

After we hear from God's Word, we first respond and then receive His gifts at His **TABLE**. We respond to hearing God's Word through confessing our faith with a creed, giving an offering, and praying to Him. God tells us in many places in Scripture that He listens to our prayers. Knowing this helps us to pray more confidently, with full faith and assurance. After this response, we receive another gift from God through communion. God gives us forgiveness through the body/bread and blood/wine of Jesus. Through this, God tells us we will have eternal life! This is an incredible gift God gives us, the most important gift, and we have the opportunity to partake of it during worship through the Lord's Supper. (Psalm 5:3, John 6:53-58)

Finally, we end our worship with God **SENDING** us. It is an opportunity for worshipers to be empowered by a blessing to do God's will as we depart from worship. We often do a closing prayer, benediction, dismissal/charge and a closing song. Jesus charges us to go out and tell His story. Worship helps us do that by teaching us, filling us up with the Holy Spirit, and building our faith, so that we can go out and share the good news of Jesus with all whom we meet. (Matthew 28:16-20)

These four walls make up our worship on Sundays and for the most part, these do not change. Occasionally we might not do communion for one reason or another, but we still respond to the Word in the faith. Sometimes we have multiple scripture readings, other times we have one focused scripture. Sometimes we do a call to worship, other times we go straight into the opening hymn. Sometimes our pastor leads us in the prayers of the church, other times we use an alternate form of prayer where we sing. Regardless of these little changes, the focus of each portion stays the same and the order does not change. After all the walls have been built, we usually put in the "doors and windows". In worship, these are ways to encounter God. Typically, these include prayers, music, and utilizing tradition, especially the Christian Church Year. I will spend the next couple of weeks writing about these things, as there are a lot of ways to look at these encounters. I look forward to more discussion with you and to worshipping with you on Sunday! Blessings, Jon Vevia

**Go in peace, be joyful in hope, and faithful in prayer. Amen!**

Today, October 27th at our 9:15am worship service, we will remember the Reformation, an event which happened over 500 years ago. For this year's Reformation service, we will be doing a cantata. A cantata is a worship service with music, scripture, and reflective readings, something we do often during Holy Week, usually on Good Friday. Lutheran churches have been using cantatas as their worship services since Bach's time.

The cantata will focus on what are known as the "Five Solas": *sola gratia, sola fide, solus Christus, sola scriptura, and soli Deo gloria*. *The five solas were the Protestant Reformers attempt to summarize biblical teachings on salvation: with Scripture alone as the only, final, decisive, authority on truth, God's grace alone, on the basis of Christ alone, received through faith alone, to the glory of God alone. The reception of these truths — found in the Bible — is not about what some people thought 500 years ago. It's about how we can experience everlasting judgment or joy forever. God has been unbelievably kind to reveal Himself to us and has allowed us to know Him in a personal, loving way. These solas still echo in our world and our lives today.*

Sunday morning we will reflect on each of these 'solas', *through scripture, narration, and song...a Reformation Cantata. We encourage you to listen to the music sung by the choir, look at the words on the screen, reflect on the words spoken, and sing loudly on the hymns we sing together. This will be a great opportunity to worship God and thank Him for His truth of salvation: according to scripture alone, by grace alone through faith alone, in Christ alone...to God be all the glory. We can have faith and joy in knowing that we are celebrating these truths with the whole Church of believers, both past, present, and future, celebrating Jesus Christ and what he did for us on the cross.*

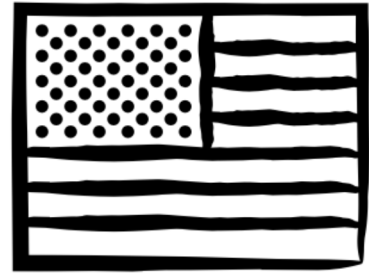
