NEXT STEPS

Reflect:

Get in the Word:

- In the Nicene Creed we confess that Jesus rose from the dead "according to the Scriptures," just as God had always promised in His Word. Spend some time this week in these Old Testament Scriptures that foretold Christ's resurrection:
 - o Psalm 16:8-11; 22:30-31; 110:1; 118:22-24
 - o Isaiah 25:7-8; 53:10
 - o Jonah 1:17 (see Matthew 12:39-40)
 - o Job 19:25-27

 Pray that the resurrection of Jesus would give you life in every way as you live each day that He has made with joy and gladness.
