# Minutes of Congregational Meeting 6/10/2019

Meeting called to order by Chairman Eidler at 6:15PM.

An additional 5 minutes was given to late arrivers to review the packet of reports.

Minutes to last Congregational meeting suspended until located.

Debbie Valentine reported that current enrollment is 292 with summer tours scheduled and additional families still considering enrollment. Goal is for 300 to start school.

Board of Directors Elected: Erik Eidler, Taylor Scott and Mason Payer.

Questions regarding reports:

- Pastor Tobey's report: will need a strong mission statement. Erik explained that BOD is working on policy and we are waiting for Sr. Pastor and Exec Director to finalize.
- When was last time school enrollment 300 or more? Debbie replied 2008

Paul Hough introduced 2019-20 Budget. He explained that the current year deficit was reduced to \$235K by using \$68K in contingency. Special gifts of \$165K reduced to budget deficit to around \$75K depending on June offerings. Total debt is \$536K. Sanctuary fund has approx. \$1 million and \$900K was moved to a 3 year note with LCEF to obtain an additional 1% interest.

- What are offerings compared to last year? Close to last year and slightly under \$700K budget.
- Why have there been no sermons on tithing? Pastor Tobey has 3 sermons in Nov on stewardship. Erik indicated that we would have a renewed focus to create a "stewardship culture" with new pastor.
- What was the result of stewardship cards given out after Thanksgiving? Pastor Patrick said that the return was so low that nothing could be achieved by using them.
- Paul Hough indicated that this budget was a worst case scenario with a 2% increase in offerings a tuition increase of 2%, slightly reduced student aid and based on 290 students enrolled.
- How are international students recruited? David Haynes works with several agencies giving out information on Trinity and these agencies recruit the students. Also word of mouth from previous students in their home countries. For next year there is 1 High School and possibly 1 middle school.
- Line item for Yearbooks is \$4500. Why are students not charged for them. No Answer was given.
- Why is Janitorial services at \$55K. Last year was in salaries and is now an expense. Staff and other volunteers do cleaning which is outside services contract. There is a need for volunteers to do weekend cleaning after uses. Concern expressed for importance of cleaning God's house and making a good impression for visitors.
- Are you aware that there is an International School on OB Riley Rd. Debbie indicated that this school was for families living in Bend who had students with need for international studies.
- Are projections based on 1 teacher per grade for K-8. Debbie reported that we will have 9 teachers and when a class is over 18 then a part time aide is used to help.
- Are there any grades lower than the others? Smallest enrollment is 1<sup>st</sup> grade at 13. Freshman class is highest in school history with 18 coming from 8<sup>th</sup> grade class and additional from outside.
- Senior Living Center should be relabeled "Mortgage."
- Page 4 Tuition Assistance: This will be looked at very hard for the 20-21 school year to reduce.
- Why not list need to volunteer help in the Bulletin? Chuck reported that asking 1 to 1 has the best result.

- The deficit for the last 2 years is very troubling and goes against principles of good stewardship. Why should we vote for this? Erik reported that the situation of 5 years in the making and will not be fixed overnight. Avenues for having a balanced budget would have severe effect on Trinity Ministry and would likely be a one year balanced budget. Investing in a professional administrator is hoped to bring about new avenues of funding, in particular student tuition assistance. A comment was made that the "mechanics" of this budget were much improved over the previous years and the potential for reaching the balance was much better than before. "I'm not voting on a deficit, but voting on an opportunity."

Motion made by Steve Waring to approve the budget and 2<sup>nd</sup> by Ron Mauer.

### Board of Directors (Elect three)

#### **Carol Podwils**

Carol has been a member of Trinity since 1976. She has served Trinity for 40+ years in different roles: classroom teacher, elementary music teacher, choir director, organist, as well as Director of School and Church Music. She "retired" in 2017, but continues to play for worship services and accompany music groups. She served on the Board of Directors this past year, filling in a one-year position. She is married to Mark.

#### **Holly R. Hutchins**

Holly R. Hutchins and his wife, Sharon, have been members of Trinity since 2005. In the past, Holly has served on a staff search committee for Trinity School, and a new sanctuary funding committee. Sharon currently serves on Trinity's Altar Guild. Holly is a native Oregonian who retired to Bend in 2005. Prior to moving to Bend, he spent 17 years in Houston, Texas, with Shell Oil Company, working in public affairs and corporate communications. He holds a master's degree in public relations from the University of Houston, a journalism degree from the University of Oregon, and worked at several Oregon newspapers before joining the corporate sector. Since moving to Bend, he's been a regular contributor to several Central Oregon lifestyle magazines, and currently teaches business writing and general business classes at Central Oregon Community College. Holly has served on the Board of Directors for the past year.

#### **David Lyon, Ph.D.**

Raised in Yakima, Washington, David Lyon received his B.S. in Chemistry from Western Washington University and Ph.D. in Inorganic Chemistry from the University of Oregon. Following a Post-Doctoral stint at the California Institute of Technology, David joined Bend Research as a Research Chemist in 1991. During his tenure at Bend Research he held positions of increasing responsibility culminating in the role of Senior Vice President, Research prior to the company's acquisition by Capsugel and, subsequently, Lonza. He currently serves as a Sr. Fellow, Research. David is a life-long Lutheran having been baptized, raised and confirmed in the LCA/ELCA. David married Tharon (who has served several stints as a TLS teacher) in 1990 and they have been members at Trinity since 1998. Both of their adult children, Alex and Johanna, were educated at Trinity. David has previously served on the Trinity Board of Directors and numerous ad hoc committees.

Hello to my brothers and sisters of Trinity

Thank you for participating in our annual voters meeting. We are living in a strange time, to say the least. I would be remiss if I did not start with a shout out to our leadership team and staff who have all been working extremely hard as a result. I commend our team, who remain optimistic and focused, despite continually moving goal posts and targets. To all, I want to say Thank You from the bottom of my (our) heart. God is Good!

Your board of directors has been working hard with leadership to balance all of our desires to get back together in person, with safety and prudence, as this is a long run and not a sprint. The environment around the pandemic has not stopped work, but it has created a few nuances that we want to be transparent about:

- A. Typically, we hold our annual voters assembly in June (end of our fiscal year) to approve a budget, new board members, as well as to update and conduct any necessary business at hand. As you can see, we delayed this until August so we could find a way to safely meet in person.
  - a. With a later meeting date, the Board of Directors approved extending terms of officers and retiring board members until a voters assembly could be held but not longer than for 3 months.
  - b. While we did not have a formal budget approved starting for July 1, we continued operating in the interim based on the draft budget and understanding that we had ample liquidity to manage the interim period. We did not want to rush knowing we needed to understand what opening in 2020/2021 would look like and what additional costs would be necessary to operate safely. We now have a better idea and hence a budget for the current year is presented for congregational approval.

However, we continue to operate in an extremely dynamic environment with rules changing on a regular basis. Please do not be surprised if we have another voters assembly in October and January to revise budgets based on real situation on the ground.

It is a big deal to re-open our school and eventually our indoor church services. This does entail risk. OUR #1 PRIORITY is the health and safety of the Trinity family and all who we interact with. We will not operate in an environment of fear, but one of being knowledgeable, cautious and conservative. We believe we can manage the risk if everyone works together with a common set of goal and priorities. If we have two options, we will not cut corners, we will pick the smart and right one. We do appreciate your understanding and patience as we work through this. If we thought this was too dangerous or too risky, we would not be moving forward. If it gets to a point where the risk seems elevated, we will pull back, review and adjust as best we can. This will be dynamic and I can guaranty that over the next 6-9 months we will have more than one pullback to re-assess. Leadership has learned a lot over the past 4 months and we continue to learn daily. We believe if done right, we can operate safely in person, again provided we all work together. Let's be great examples to the Bend community.

Today, we are humbly asking the congregation to approve the largest deficit budget in the history of Trinity. Let's call it what it is. It sucks. This will be very expensive to manage through the pandemic safely; but less expensive than other alternatives. Closing our school ministry is not an option, or should I say a last last last option. Once we make that decision there is no turning back. The Lord would not have prepared us over the past year if he did not think we were up to the challenge. He brought us new leadership in Pastor Caleb and Gregg. He brought us a more stable platform to weather a pandemic. He brought us additional resources to bridge the next year. He has gifted us with so much dedication and talent in our staff. Of course, none of this is possible without you. I am so impressed how strong this congregation has been over than last couple years as we manage through some dynamic. Small story: I looked back on our notes from when I started this role in late 2018, and we were in much tougher financial situation. We looked to borrow and reinvest in a sustainable platform to get us to another 50+ years of school ministry at Trinity. I found a simple one sentence email that said – "I think we should borrow a little extra just in case something strange happens". I am convinced the Lord knew this was coming and used his hand to make sure we were as ready as possible as Trinity's opportunity to do his work in Bend is so great and there is so much need. Yes – We ask approval for a "bad" budget but can still say – God is Good! He has our back, so to speak. Always has, always will.

To reiterate, here is why your Leadership can recommend the attached budget and the plan to move forward:

- 1) The recommended budget and action plan are unanimously supported by your Boards.
- 2) The budget is not as bad as it looks as we have received almost \$420k in forgivable funds from the PPP. We had initially planned to have another small loss of about \$75k in 20/21 and back to sustainable break even in 21/22 and beyond. Strangely enough, we remain on that path despite the pandemic. Unfortunately, we were well ahead of plan until this started.
- 3) Leadership and staff have put in the hard work to create a reasonable plan with safeguards and alternatives and contingencies to let us navigate on a consistent basis for the next year. The team is working well together and is unified.
- 4) We have the financial resources to do this right. We would not support moving forward if we did not have the resources to do it right. **I do caution** – at present we can only make this work for one year. If it does extend longer, and we continue to do the hard work on His behalf, I trust He will provide again. We will tackle that issue if the time comes.
- 5) The BOD and Finance committee have established check points and milestones to keep us on track. We are also working to ensure that should things all go against us in 2020/21, we can adjust and pivot to various models. We will always retain enough liquidity and capital to drive as soft a landing as possible and not a train wreck should the storm clouds get that dark. Many alternatives have been modeled and we feel comfortable we can manage, but there would be damage if the wind blows in our face all year.

Thank You again for your love and support of Trinity. We on the Board of Directors work for you. Please do not be shy to let us know thoughts, concerns, praises etc. We are in the together and on the same team. Let us keep our heads up and come out of this stronger so we can continue to be a beacon to those we serve and those in need who we hope to serve in the future.

## 2019/2020 Financial Report and 2020/2021 Budget Overview

### 2019/2020 – Year in Review

#### Financial Results

- Voters approved a budget deficit for the year of (\$183,544)
  - Preliminary year-end results indicate a deficit of (\$168,587), an improvement of \$14,687 from the budget
- Major impacts to the year-end results:
  - Offerings were strong, at 99% of budget
  - Expenses were under budget by \$153,233, but income was also below budget by \$138,276
    - App. \$50K of this came from a change to account for tuition payments for the following school year (example – June payments made for the school year starting in August/September) – in the past all payments were included in the current fiscal year
    - We had \$0 in development income from the Auction, as the funds attained were used for infrastructure expenses for the coming school year due to Covid-19 - budget was for \$83K in income after expenses
  - The new Trinity Fund received gifts of \$48,913

#### Major Events impacting overall Financial Health of Trinity

- In early November, we closed on a new mortgage loan that refinanced all old debt and provided an additional \$405,000 in working capital. The new loan is for a 20 year term at 4.375% interest, also reducing our annual operational expense by \$16,400
- A parcel of land was sold to the City of Bend for the Empire project – after the cost of modifying and repaving the parking lot, we netted \$68,609, which was placed in our capital reserve fund and is now being used for plant improvements
- We received special gifts of nearly \$100K to be used for school expenses
- As soon as Congress passed the CARES act, we applied for and received \$419,242 from the Payroll Protection Program. This program is a forgivable loan if the proceeds are used for designated items, specifically payroll costs, mortgage interest and utilities. It is



our opinion that our proceeds, effectively a grant, will be fully forgiven based on our proper use of the funds as predicated by the Small Business Association.

### 2020/2021 Budget Overview – See attached Budget Summary

#### Budget Process

- Trinity Leadership was asked to provide 3 budget scenarios outlining potential impacts of government shutdowns due to the Covid-19 pandemic:
  - Scenario A – Business as usual with no shutdowns or Covid-19 related regulations, such as social distancing or Personal Protective Equipment
  - Scenario B – School operates for 1<sup>st</sup> semester with social distancing and PPE requirements
  - Scenario C – School operates for full year with social distancing and PPE requirements
    - Requirements include 35 square feet of space for each student, and face masks for all students and teachers
- Due to the uncertainty of when the slowdown to the pandemic will occur, the Finance Committee and Board of Directors chose Scenario C as the most realistic and conservative approach to creation of a spending plan for this fiscal year

#### Budget Highlights - Expenses

- During the early months of the pandemic, it was determined that the church and school needed technology support for church services, distance learning preparation and technology assistance for our school parents. As such, we have budgeted for a full time Tech position beginning in August
- To support Pastor Caleb in his ministerial duties, we have budgeted a new full time position to begin in January. The title and role of this new position are yet to be determined
- Due to the requirements for social distancing in the classrooms, specifically the 35 sq. ft rule, some classes will need to be split up with the end result of the need for more teachers and/or aides
  - The budget for Scenario C calls for the following additional staffing changes:
    - 4 new teachers



- Moving 2 current part-time teachers to full-time
- Adding 2 new full-time aides and 1 part-time aide
- Adding a Custodian
- Adding a Day Cleaner
- Note: additional expenses are being incurred for the technology needs for in-class and potential distance learning, PPE infrastructure, and other PPE needs – these expenses are not in the budget thanks to the gifts we received and the auction proceeds used to purchase new iPads and Chromebooks for our younger grades (K-5)

#### Budget Highlights – Revenue

- Increase of 4% to offerings to \$743,600
- Giving to Trinity Fund of \$70,000
- School Tuition based on current student body projection of 307 students
- Development proceeds of \$80,000 from the annual auction

#### Proposed Budget

- The end result of Scenario C is a projected budget deficit of (\$501,616)
  - Note: Scenario A had a projected budget deficit of app. (\$140,000)
  - Note: Scenario B had a projected budget deficit of app. (\$400,000)

#### How do we pay for this? – Liquidity Overview

- The additional proceeds from our loan refinance and the PPP funds total over \$824,000
  - After subtracting our loss of \$168,587 for 2019/2020, and our projected loss of \$501,616 for 2020/2021, we will still have over \$153,000 in available operational capital for the future, plus access to our line of credit of \$300,000
