OBITUARY FOR SCOTT McCRAY

Scott Baldwin McCray, 62, passed away on Friday, February 28 at Partners in Care Hospice House in Bend, Oregon after suffering for many years from FTD, frontotemporal degeneration. He was born on June 17, 1957 in Los Angeles, CA to Kent Baldwin McCray and Ruth Senkel McCray. Scott grew up in Northridge, CA. He graduated from Los Angeles Baptist High School in Northridge in 1975. After high school he attended UCLA, earning his BS, MS, and PhD in chemical engineering. He began work with Bend Research, currently Lonza, in 1985 and stayed with them for over 30 years. He worked in the lab, managed projects and wrote papers, grants and patents for Bend Research. He once described it as his dream job. Scott married Kelly Bailey McCray in 1985 in Van Nuys, CA. They were faithfully and happily married for 34 years and loved raising their family. Scott was an active member of Trinity Lutheran Church in Bend where he served as a church officer, sang in the choir and praise team, ran the sound board during services, and helped out in any way that he could. Scott enjoyed music very much and played the flute, guitar and trombone. He also composed and recorded his own songs, most of them about his Christian faith. Scott is survived by his wife, Kelly; their children Erienne McCray of Portland, OR, Spencer McCray of Bend, OR, Alyssa McCray McCance of Bend, OR; his sisters Debbie McCray Kressin of Chico, CA, Kristen McCray Trent of Rowlands Castle, Hampshire, UK, and Carolyn McCray Montgomery of Chino Hills, CA; his stepmother Susan Sukman McCray of Westlake Village, CA; and 7 nieces and nephews and their families. He was preceded in death by his parents Kent Baldwin McCray and Ruth Senkel McCray. A memorial service will be held at Trinity Lutheran Church, 2550 NE Butler Market Rd, Bend, Oregon on Saturday, March 28 at 11:00. A meal will be held following the service where the family will be greeting friends and relatives.
